

Preface to ANZACPE's Supervisory Standards

ANZACPE has three Accreditation Levels

**Clinical Pastoral
Supervisor
(CPSup)**



**Clinical Pastoral
Educator
(CPEd)**



**Clinical Pastoral
Education-Consultant
(EdConsult)**

Accreditation (and **Reaffirmation of Accreditation**) at each of these Levels indicates ANZACPE's confidence in the supervisory competence and educational capacity of an individual.

Each Level brings its own valid and unique contribution to the provision of CPE within Australia and New Zealand.

Each Level has a preliminary status called '**Provisional**' prior to Accreditation.

Provisional

Your CPE Association (in dialogue with you) determines:

- your readiness for this status
- the conditions governing your practice whilst working within this status
- the education and supervision that you are required to undertake
- your readiness to seek accreditation

The ANZACPE Standards for **CPSup** and **CPEd** mandate:

- The number of CPE units you must supervise
- The hours of supervision you need to undertake during each CPE Unit
- The hours of education-in-supervision you need to complete whilst holding your provisional status

This provisional status is a **temporary status** i.e. a maximum of 4 years before you must either seek accreditation, or seek provisional status again (for a maximum of 2 years) - otherwise the provisional status lapses.

Accreditation

When you and your CPE Association believe that you are ready to present for **Accreditation**, you are reviewed by a **Review Committee**.

Each Review Committee, (cognizant of the ANZACPE Standards for **CPSup** or **CPEd** or **EdConsult**) will be looking for evidence that you have demonstrated a **consistent and mature competence** in all the competencies expected of at each level.

The accreditation for **CPSup** is a member Association process that is organised by **your CPE Association**

The accreditation for **CPEd** and **Ed Consult** is an ANZACPE process. The ANZACPE Review Committee will make its assessment of your readiness for Accreditation, and present a report of its progress, including commendations and recommendations, to the Professional Standards Committee. This report will be sent to your Member Association, **as it is your member Association that ultimately accredits you.**

You may stay working at your Accredited Level (being reviewed every 5 years) - or work towards Accreditation at the next Level.
