Objectives:

To explore what we mean by 'reflective practice' and 'appreciative inquiry'

Allyson lives in New Zealand, is a registered social worker and has long involvement with the tertiary education sector through teaching, research, leadership and management. Allyson has been engaged with professional supervision for over 30 years as an educator and researcher and through private supervision practice.
